



2018 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

New Homes Mandate

In a policy heard around the world, nearly all new homes in California will be built with solar PV starting in 2020, and many will include storage as well. The advocacy that led to this decision dates back to the push for solar-ready home requirements in 2003. In 2018, the California Energy Commission recognized solar as universally cost-effective. The CEC also created an option for energy storage to help meet the standards.



Self-Generation Incentive Program

A highlight of 2018 was passage of SB 700, which will add up to \$800 million to the SGIP budget. It took two years with a lot of help from a lot of people, but CALSSA defied the odds and overcame many obstacles to get the bill passed and signed.

After research showed that the earliest SGIPfunded storage systems caused a slight increase in greenhouse gas emissions, policy makers have been developing new rules to ensure the trend does not continue. CALSSA demonstrated that outdated rate design was the culprit and has already been fixed, and we worked to ensure that the new rules are not excessively burdensome.

NEM Solar Plus Storage

CALSSA worked hard to advance our proposal to allow customers to install DC-coupled solar plus storage systems larger than 10 kW under net metering and to allow larger AC-coupled systems without additional metering. This new rule will enable customers to store solar power in the daytime and discharge it onto the grid in the evening for high value net metering credits. It will also enable batteries to be used for self-supply while maintaining net metering for solar.

Rates

Years of debate over shifting peak periods in time-of-use rates concluded in 2018. The rate cases mostly ended in the utilities' favor, but CALSSA was successful in trimming some of the worst aspects and gaining approval for new rates designed specifically for customers with energy storage.

Consumer Protection

When customers sign agreements they do not understand, it can harm individuals and the market. Policy makers are interested in regulating

the solar sales process. CALSSA negotiated the content of a contract cover sheet and a consumer guide, and debated a new process for responding to consumer complaints.

Permitting

CALSSA's permitting hotline helps members get local approval for projects and keeps fees in check. We coordinated with fire protection officials in the rollout of new standards for setbacks and pathways. We worked with state agencies to develop a book of best practices on permitting energy storage and helped produce and distribute storage fact sheets for building departments.

Interconnection

CALSSA has taken a leadership role in a stakeholder group that is rewriting core pieces of Rule 21. Our proposals include setting timelines for grid upgrade work, reducing upgrade costs, and replacing proxies used in interconnection review with actual grid hosting capacity according to publicly available data. The proposals are awaiting CPUC decisions.

CALSSA stepped in to help when residential customers were increasingly tagged with costs to upgrade transformers after they had installed solar. We clarified the process for customers to request pre-installation review and convinced utilities to accept enhanced inverter settings in lieu of upsizing transformers.

Separately, CALSSA is making sure smart inverter standards do not push interconnection off the rails. Utility implementation plans would have brought the market to a standstill for all sizes of projects. We rang alarm bells and caused utilities to change their plans.

Solar Water Heating Incentives

CALSSA successfully advocated for increased incentive levels for commercial pools and pushed to delay the termination of the CSI-Thermal program for six months. We have been busy teeing up the next phase of policy support after that program has expired. We got solar water heating included in plans for new programs in the Central Valley and laid the groundwork for eligibility in statewide programs.

Protecting Against Legislative Attacks

A coalition of utility employees is seeking every opportunity to push bill provisions limiting the value of distributed energy resources. In 2018, they inserted language attacking local solar and storage into a bill about responding to fire risks. CALSSA mobilized forces and assembled a coalition to fight back. After months of high tension, the offending language was struck from the bill.


